#### Overview

As South Africa marks its 30th year of democracy, and with elections taking place at the end of this month (29 May), in this interactive film showing and discussion, we reflect on the nation's first historic democratic elections and the global anti-apartheid movement that preceded it. Filmmaker and International Election Observer, Erik Ponder, will lead a discussion that places his short documentary—Election Day, Freedom Day, Miracle Day—in conversation with the award-winning seven-part documentary Have You Heard from Johannesburg.

Attendees are encouraged to watch part five of the documentary, titled From Selma to Soweto, prior to the event. We recommend that registrants pre-check to see if they can access the documentary—many US institutions provide access to the film via Kanopy.
